- 3. Read Luke 11:1-10. How does the point of this story shift when we realize that Jesus is *CONTRASTING* God (not comparing) with the stingy neighbor?
- 4. Why did the message suggest that God might makes us wait for His help, if he isn't uncaring or stingy?
- 5. Re-read verses 9-10. How do these verses seem to describe God's willingness or eagerness to help?
- 6. In light of this message, how would you advise someone who has been waiting for God's help for a very long time, and is starting to lose hope?

DIGGING DEEPER (EXTRA CREDIT!)

- 7. Read Luke 18:1-8. How does that story resemble and differ from this one? How do the two work together to provide a fuller picture of God's heart and for the relationship he wants with us?
- 8. Take a moment to bring your most challenging need to God, focusing on his heart as a loving father rather than a stingy neighbor. Can you be persistent in this request without losing trust in God as loving and generous?
