- 5. Talk about the disgusting nature of Canaanite culture. Why was Jesus right to condemn it, and why did she still have hope that he might want to help her?
- 6. What does it mean to respond to God's judgement with God's promises? Refer to Romans 3:23 to identify how both are sandwiched into a single verse. Can we practice this when condemnation comes from others or even ourselves?
- 7. How did the woman turn a possible insult (being called a dog) into an opportunity? Why was Jesus so impressed by that?

- 8. Read Luke 5:32. Are you prepared to accept the titles of "sick" and sinner" to receive Jesus' saving help? Why do many struggle to do so?
- 9. What does it mean for you to sacrifice your pride rather than your loved ones? What could that look like in your life this week?
